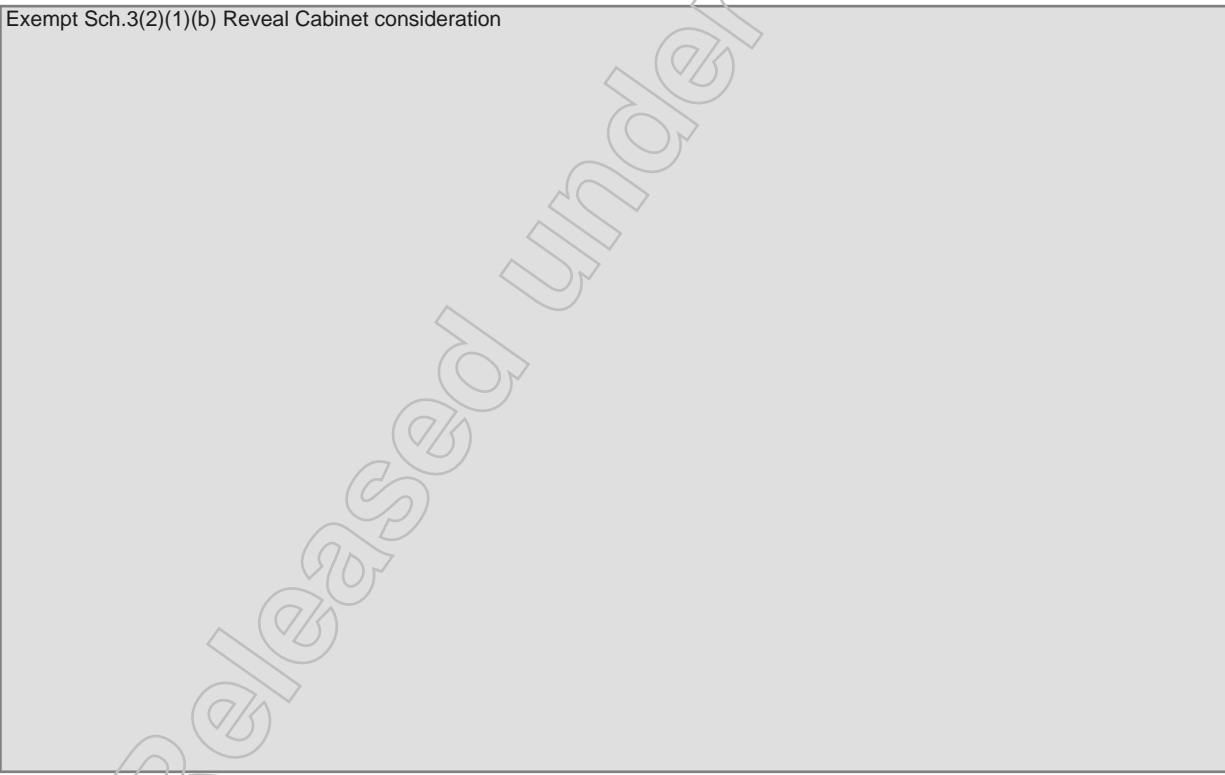



Dear all

As you are probably all aware, the Attorney-General introduced three Bills into Parliament yesterday which were debated and passed last night - well early this morning in fact. The Bills were:

- Vicious Lawless Association Disestablishment Bill 2013
- Criminal Law (Criminal Organisations Disruption) Amendment Bill 2013 (This is the Bill that contains the amendments to the CM Act)
- Tattoos Parlours Bill 2013.

The Bills are the culmination of work by officers from Strategic Policy - the Vicious Lawlessness Bill and the Criminal Law Bill and our colleagues at the Office of Regulatory Policy, Fair Trading - [REDACTED] etc who worked on the Tattoo Parlours Bill. Police and CMC officers also contributed.

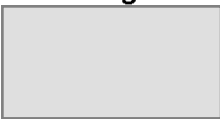
We received instructions on Monday 30 September 2013 to progress this package of reforms. If you look at the Bills you will see how extensive the drafting and work is. It was a difficult package to put together. Officers attended the Cabinet meeting on Monday and an opposition and then

independents briefing at Parliament for several hours yesterday. Over 200 pages in total. Instructions for Amendments in Consideration in Detail were received yesterday evening and were developed last night and finally supplied at about 10.30 pm.

I would like to acknowledge the leadership shown by [redacted] and [Out of Scope] in pulling this together and the work by [redacted] (from DPC) [redacted] in delivering this package of reforms and supporting [redacted]. The Criminal Law Bill in particular involved amendments to CMC legislation, the Criminal Code, Bail Act and PPRA. I also thank the rest of the crim team for their support to [redacted] and generally all of you in SP who provided support or encouragement over the last two weeks. Also thanks to [redacted] for pulling the Billbooks together and to [redacted] for delivering them to Parliament at 6.30 last night. It was a real team effort.

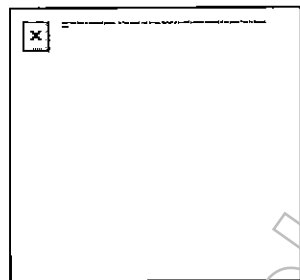

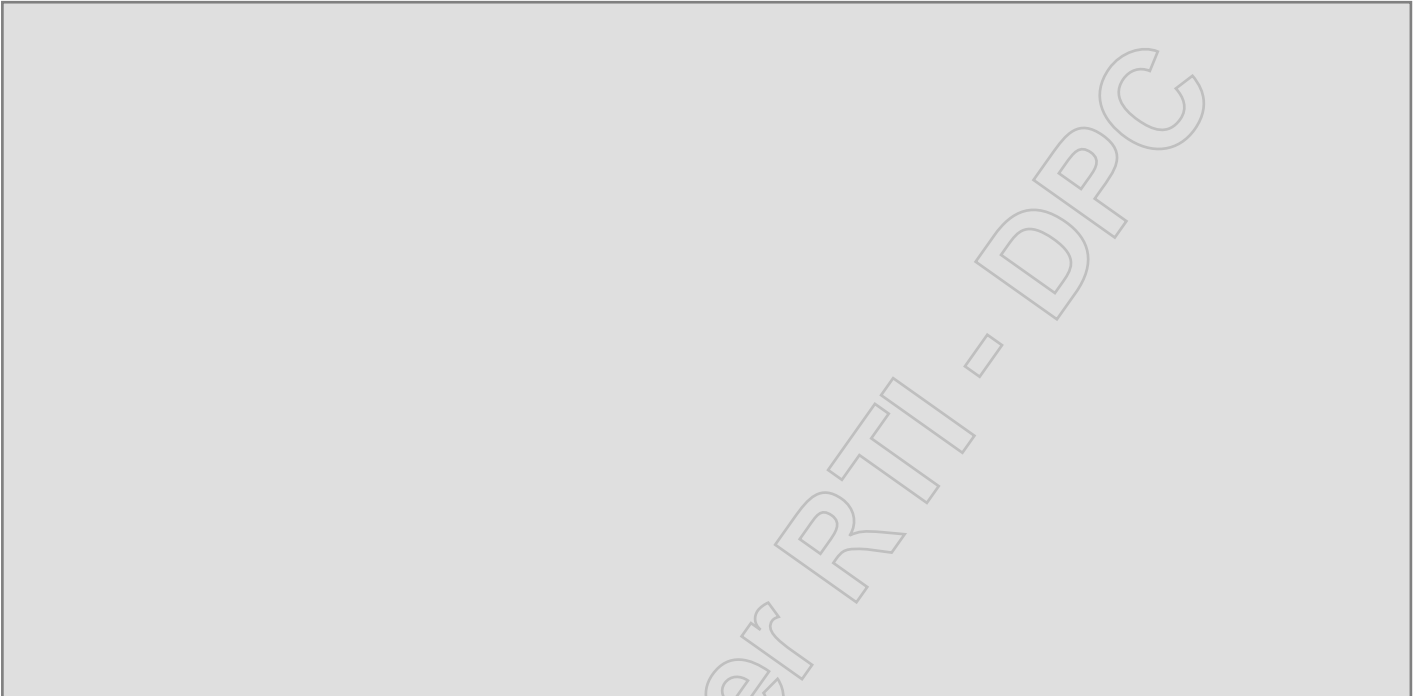
