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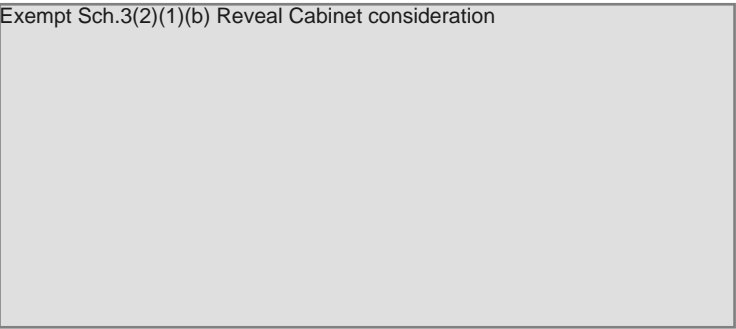

To All Generation Services Colleagues,

Many of you were present today at the short information session conducted by James Archer at Kenny St Depot with regard to the independent review released on the weekend.

The outcome of the session was, that no information was provided at all by Ergon, as to the future of Generation services. This was expected.

One thing that was noted is that, at the completion of the session, James Archer asked the group if they had any questions....The room was deafly silent.

James commented at that point that "Everyone must be comfortable at this stage then".

I beg to differ..the silence is clearly an indication that the workgroup as a whole is completely uncomfortable with this issue, and the silence is a result of the complete loss of trust that Ergon has created within our department as a result of the recent closed door management meetings, complete lack of consultation and reasonable, informative communication in regard to this matter.

Some things are for certain:-

- * Government will not call for, and then receive, a thorough independent review of an industry which results in over 40 clear recommendations and then, go on to ignore the review. This will not happen!
- * Recommendation 27 and 28.
- * If any, or all of recommendation 27 and 28 are implemented it will result in job losses and redundancies throughout Generation Services as a whole.
- * These job losses will not be confined to the Generation Workshop, tradespeople....they will be across the department ranging from mid level management, the design department and engineers, the support staff such as admin and schedulers, Generation Operations, Torres Strait Staff, Mobile and Embedded, Barcardine Crew, Remote Depots, Remote PSA's and power workers. No position (including James' himself) will be secure until this is over.

I had the opportunity to talk briefly with a senior ETU representative shortly after the meeting and the following items were discussed :-

- * The ETU has been expecting this to eventuate, it is not surprising at all
- * The ETU has already got response measures in place, that are to be

implemented as soon as a clear understanding of Ergon, and the Governments intentions are.

* The battle to save jobs, not only in Generation, but in all of the remote depots will need to be rapid and very public. This is what will happen if these recommendations are implemented.

* It is now time for everyone of us to be prepared to respond to potential job losses, and outsourcing of any of our core work.

I urge all Generation Personnel to support any action we may need to take to prevent any job losses within our department, and to stand up against the outsourcing of our work to the likes of Theiss and Lend Lease etc.

I also urge anyone working in Generation who is not an ETU member (this includes engineers, mechanical staff, administration staff, PSA's..or anyone who may be affected) to immediately go to the website and complete an application. We, and you, need to be prepared to save our jobs and prevent the Government from taking a wrecking ball to Generation Services.
