Hello, please see follow up qs re Wellcamp and DP's response.

Please attribute to a spokesperson for Deputy Premier Steven Miles:

QRAC will continue to give health authorities options to help keep Queenslanders safe, and supports individuals with quarantine and isolation accommodation in a range of circumstances. This has included guests who have tested positive to COVID-19 but do not have a suitable place to safely isolate, such as:

- Travellers who couldn't access an outbound international flights and were left with no where to stay
- People from evacuation centres due to recent flooding events that have been identified as positive
- Homeless persons
- People who live with at-risk or immunocompromised individuals, for example, a mother undertaking cancer treatment
- Large families, including refugees
- Individuals with significant health needs and requiring disability support
- Victims of domestic violence who don't have safe place to isolate.

This is proving to protect the vulnerable groups in our community who are most at risk from COVID.

Queensland authorities have met with representatives of the cruise ship industry to discuss options to use QRAC for international/interstate arrivals if a COVID-19 outbreak occurs on a cruise ship.

If there is an outbreak of COVID, passengers will be accommodated at QRAC, if these passengers cannot travel home or do not have suitable accommodation.

As with other jurisdictions it was vital to secure a quarantine facility to keep Queenslanders safe and to reduce reliance on our hospitals and hotel quarantine.

QRAC was the first new purpose-built facility in the country to open. It has had around 600 guests so far across isolation and quarantine uses. The facility continues to act as the insurance policy we built it for. And such a facility, still receiving guests, requires staff to run the facility.

If Queensland had relied on the Commonwealth to build the Pinkenba facility we would have had no secure, government-managed, isolation and quarantine available at all. The Pinkenba facility was supposed to be completed by 31 March. The Commonwealth have advised that it will now not be finalised until the end of June at the earliest, with a commissioning period required in July. This is too late for the 600 people who have already utilised QRAC.

When we had the Omicron outbreak and the next wave, we saw significant pressure on the health system and hospital beds. But because we have had this purpose built facility, staffed by the appropriate skill mix, we have diverted people with covid, who are well, away from hospital beds. The facility continues to support our health system.

The capacity of the facility was developed with this in mind. The decision to bring any further beds on-line would be made by the program board based on health advice.

Hey guys,

I am writing a story for tomorrow's paper about how the government doesn't know whether all 1000 beds at Wellcamp are going to be used. It follows an inquiry I lodged with the department late last week. Jarrod Bleijie has made a number of comments, including about the manager of QRAC position that's being advertised at the moment.

"It was always a white elephant. The state government is going to employ someone to run a facility that won't have anyone in it. This is more wasteful spending to the tune of \$200 million from a third term government that is more interested with how things look than how things are. I am gobsmacked that the government would even consider bringing the additional 500 beds online when the centre is now useless."

I have some questions for the Deputy Premier below.

1. Has the state government found any other uses for Wellcamp yet?

2. Has the state government met with the cruise ship industry yet? If so, did anything come of that? Will Wellcamp be used for people who test positive on cruise ships?

3. Will the state government extend its current lease?

4. How can the government justify the cost of Wellcamp when it now doesn't know whether all 1000 beds will be used?

5. Mr Bleijie also said that the government should have looked at saving money and getting out of the Wellcamp contract when it realised all of the beds might not be used. Did the government consider this?

I advised that an exemption request was made for this family to undertake a period of quarantine at home at 3:20pm.

The exemption application was approved at 6:45pm. The family will be able to quarantine at their relative's home.

I am advised that transportation will be facilitated to ensure the family can travel from Wellcamp to the residence.

This is a novel and fast-moving situation. I know that our Quarantine Commissioner will be working to improve our processes into the future.

We are doing all we can to assist the Ukrainian people during this humanitarian crisis.

In particular, we have ensured that all Ukrainian arrivals into Australia are able to utilise our Hospital and Health services free of charge.

Likewise, no quarantine fees are being charged for any Ukrainian arrivals quarantining at Wellcamp.

FYI we received the following points from State Development for inclusion in the whole of government key messages this:

We're being agile and adaptable regarding how we use the Queensland Regional Accommodation Centre at Wellcamp.

The centre could play a role providing emergency housing, should councils need it. We've written to councils as local and district disaster management group reps indicating the facility is available as temporary, emergency accommodation for people impacted by flooding. Anyone relocating to Wellcamp for temporary accommodation would be housed entirely separately to people at the facility undertaking Covid-19 quarantine and isolation.

We'll work closely with councils who request accommodation be made available and can augment the existing disaster management arrangements.



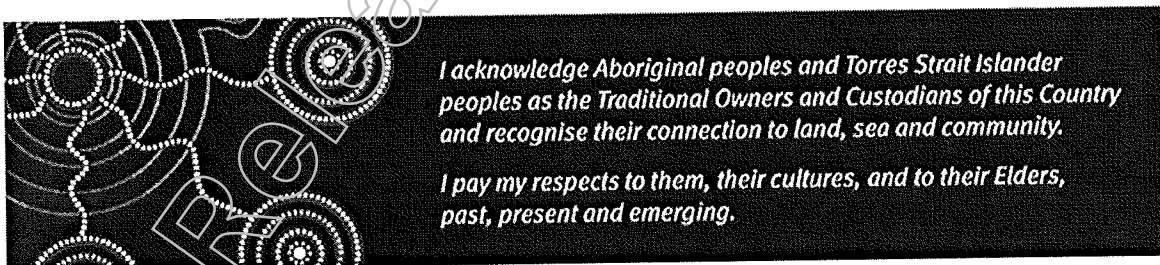
